## Requirements And Qualifications

Candidates should have obtained a Doctorate of Pharmacy degree from an accredited college of pharmacy. Those applying should be eligible for licensure in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the state of Indiana within 90 days of the start of the residency program.

## Candidate should submit the following for consideration:

- Curriculum vitae
- Three (3) letters of recommendation
- Official university transcripts
- Letter of intent
- Completed employment application from [www.jobs.walgreens.com](http://www.jobs.walgreens.com)
- Registered with the National Matching Service (NMS)

All completed materials should be submitted to PhORCAS by January 2<sup>nd</sup> for candidates to be considered for the program. Candidates may receive an invitation for an interview.



## Practice Experiences

The residency will provide goal-oriented practice environments through both longitudinal and block-style rotations including but not limited to:

- Patient Centered Dispensing (Staffing) at Walgreens Specialty Pharmacy
- Disease focused learning experiences at Walgreens Specialty Pharmacy (i.e. oncology, organ transplant, HIV, Hepatitis C, neurology)
- Publication and research project opportunities
